Mason, Eli, Oliver, Oscar and Chase are seeking sponsors and making plans for the great shaving event. All sponsorship support is greatly appreciated.



TORQUAY- DAY IN THE SURF

We're getting organised for our big day out! The catering is being sorted, thanks to the Rotary Club of Torquay who will provide their BBQ trailer and equipment, their volunteer hours managing things and our food for the day. The Strathewen Bushfire Relief Company has generously approved our grant application for funding to support this day of well-being and adventure and the day is locked in. Permission forms have been sent home today, along with an information page, outlining what's needed for the day. Payment of \$25 per student is requested and this is required prior to the day of the excursion.

After two years of not being able to run this event, we're looking forward to seeing our little surfers in action once again.

We have filled our 48 seat coach.
