As we head towards the last day of term, we are managing a steady trickle of confirmed covid cases within our student and parent group. We're in the middle of the largest impact we've seen at school. Thank you to our families who have kept up the regular Rapid Antigen Testing routine at home- your efforts are helping to limit the spread of infection. We have many people within our community who care for others at risk or have vulnerable people in their homes and we really need to continue our vigilance to reduce risk.

Just a reminder that our before and after school care program operates daily for families needing to access child care for an early drop off before 8.45am or late pick up after 3.45pm. We again, encourage all families to make sure that their children are registered with OSHC to allow for emergency use. Any children arriving at school prior to 8.45am must be booked into before school care with Brooke, as drop off prior to this time is not possible. At the end of the school day, any students not picked up by 3.45pm, will be sent down to

join the OSHC program. Our first Big Childcare OSHC School Holiday Program is planned to kick off next week and we have quite a few young people booked in. Being a much needed service in short supply in the local and wider local community, we have families from neighbouring schools registering to access the program, which is great. If work commitments affect your school holiday child care options, be sure to have a chat to Brooke.

Thankyou to our school families, for supporting their young people as we settled into term one and got back into the swing of things this year. Your support of school operation and covid management throughout the first term is greatly appreciated. It hasn't always been easy, but it has been wonderful to enjoy a whole term onsite without a hint of remote learning. I'd also like to take this opportunity to thank our amazing staff team, Di, Maree, Deb, Donna, Rod and Chan, for their great work throughout the term, going above and beyond what's required and striving to provide the best possible learning environment for 'our kids'. We have a great team.
