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# Canine Comprehension


This week we enjoyed two Canine Comprehension sessions. We had a catch up session on Monday with Sarah and 'Reef' and our usual session today with Amy and 'Ruby'. Our focus this week has been on friendship and responsibility. This program was introduced for our senior students to support their social and emotional development after two years of disruption to life. Funded through School Focused Youth Services, the program has been introduced to assist our students with navigating friendships and providing strategies to build on positive interaction with peers. Working with our senior students to assist them with social and emotional development prior to heading off to high school has been a priority.

This week we've worked on the importance of looking after others and how helping others can make you feel good. We looked at what it means to care for a pet.

We worked on a jigsaw task, exploring ways that we can show friendship to others and we came up with a list of things that we can do. We can check that people are OK, we can be a good listener, give people space when they need it, use kind and encouraging words, involve

others in what we're doing, show respect and recognise what it is that we like others to do for us. Next Wednesday will be our final Canine Comprehension session for grades 5 and 6 and we will be celebrating the 3rd birthday of Ruby, the Groodle.





In week 8 we had a special visit from Kimberly Clark – a research scientist that is currently practicing in medicinal research. We had a chance to ask her a bunch of questions about life as a scientist and had some surprising answers.

She then taught us about genetics and how genes are transferred from parents to their children. The Grade 4/5/6s had a go at making their own punnet squares and looking into how genetic information combines in different ways. The 2/3s had a crack at identifying the difference between genotypes and phenotypes and why that's important. Our Grade Prep/1s made up some really cool aliens that showed genetic inheritance and had a look at how genetic information can be expressed in a dog's face. We then had a go at tasting a chemical that is connected with the gene that can sense cauliflower and broccoli and found out some of us definitely have it, making those of us that do likely avoid these plants if we were in the wild!



Last week- the third last week of term! That's come along fast! We observed how different metals respond to magnets in the Prep-2 grade, designed mining equipment in the middle years and thought about overall mining design and how to build a mine that's super efficient. In the upper years we then expanded on the concept by thinking about how a circular economy could recycle metals properly to reduce waste and make the most of metals after mining!
