We've had a short school week, but we've managed to fit plenty into it. We kicked off with our high ability science workshop on Thursday, titled 'Insectivores' and it was a bit of an adventure in the 3-6 room. On Friday, we enjoyed plenty of music, with both Dan and his Song Room on the go and Rod joining us for his usual sessions. We've kicked off this week with day one of the NAPLAN assessments, with grades 3 and 5 completing their Writing tasks. In the senior room, we were also fortunate to be involved in a full day of great learning today, working with an author/illustrator via Zoom.

Yesterday's professional learning for staff across our small schools' network, saw Business Managers get together with an outside expert to work on the on line maintenance system we're all required to use, while all other staff worked on the 'explicit teaching' aspect of the new Victorian Teaching and Learning Model.

Coming up on Friday March 28th, we have a special whole school event with the team from the Red Cross, Pillowcase Project. Ten years ago, we were one of the first schools to take part in this project, which involves planning what to pack and take in an emergency. We worked with the project a second time a couple of years ago and in recognition of all the work that's been done over the last decade, we've been invited to take part in a session again this year.

Emotional Literacy- Research shows that students who participate in rigorously designed and well-taught Social and Emotional Learning programs demonstrate improved mental and social health, have improved relationships with peers, are less likely to engage in risky and disruptive behaviour, show improved academic outcomes and have improved capacity for help-seeking. Participation in Social and Emotional Learning programs also reduces rates of bullying among students from marginalised groups. Building a large vocabulary for emotions helps to increase emotional literacy, promote self-awareness and encourage empathy for others.

Insectivores

On Thursday we learnt about bugs and we ate them too!

In our STEAM session with Dr Shasta, who is a scientist, we looked at edible bugs and critters from around the world and how people have been eating them for hundreds of years. We looked at food shortages being a problem and how insects are a good source of protein and fat. We got to eat cricket corn chips, made in Australia using farmed crickets that have been dried out and turned into cricket flour. The corn chips tasted like normal corn chips, but they had better levels of nutrition and more iron than spinach.

When: Tuesday April 1st 5.00pm- 7.00pm

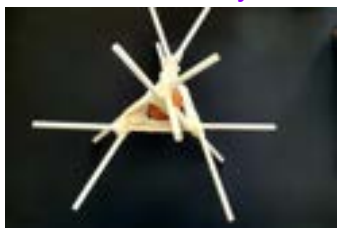
Where: Here at school!
